"Who can champion recovery?"

**Dr David Best, Reader in Criminal Justice,
University of the West of Scotland**

The concept of “recovery” is emerging as a new paradigm for supporting long-term change in the addictions field. But what does the concept really mean and can everyone equally claim to be promoting recovery for people with drug and alcohol problems? The addictions field also has the opportunity to learn from the successes of the recovery movement in mental health – but how robust are these parallels?

Dr David Best will lead the afternoon by presenting current thinking about recovery with a particular emphasis on the potential psychologists may have to develop these ideas and practices, and will present data about the pathways to recovery evidenced in two UK studies and the impact this is having on policy and practice across the UK. An open discussion to explore these ideas will follow.
